

Meeting of the Streets, Alleys and Traffic Committee of the City of LaSalle

Wednesday, December 27, 2023

Chairman Bacidore called the Meeting to order at 6:13pm

ROLL CALL

A quorum was present.

Moved by Alderman Reynolds and seconded by Alderman Ptak to approve and place on file the minutes of the Streets, Alleys and Traffic Committee for October 2, 2023.

Voice vote, all ayes. Motion carried.

Chairman Bacidore stated that he had a meeting last week with Alderman Ptak, Brian Brown, and Horizon House representatives to discuss some additions to their request. The following motion includes all things that have been agreed upon.

Moved by Alderman Reynolds and seconded by Alderman Ptak to approve the recommendation of the Streets, Alley, and Traffic Committee regarding a request from Horizon House for three parking spaces in front of their business at 105 Marquette Street (designated spots for Horizon House parking only from M-F, 8-4pm), a stop sign for those exiting the alley near their business, a bollard at the northwest corner of the property (Horizon House will install), a metal railing on the sidewalk parallel to the building, city will stripe a crosswalk and a stop bar at the alleyway, move the flower pot closer to fire hydrant, and two memorial benches up against the building. Gary Hammers will be responsible for increasing lighting in the alley and the parking lot.

Brian Brown mentioned erecting the stop sign from the building, so a post would not be necessary. The bollards should help keep any trucks or vehicles away from the side of the building and away from the stop sign that will be erected on the building. A truck should not hit the sign.

Voice vote, all ayes. Motion carried.

There were no more questions or comments from the public.

Moved by Alderman Reynolds and seconded by Alderman Crane to adjourn the meeting.

Chairman Bacidore adjourned the meeting at 6:19 p.m.
